Greetings Colleagues in Ministry,

We write to you as the Executive Presbyter and Stated Clerk of the Presbytery of Donegal. Yesterday, December 10, 2020, Pennsylvania Governor Tom Wolf and Secretary of Health Rachel Levine issued a statement with new pandemic mitigation orders. The orders prohibit indoor gatherings of more than ten people for the next three weeks, until January 4, 2021.

Communities of faith are specifically excluded from the prohibition for religious services (and only religious services.) But churches, synagogues, temples, and mosques are strongly encouraged to follow this prohibition, to save lives and to limit the strain on healthcare facilities.
